The Adams Family:

Around the World and Back Again

n the heart of Richmond, Carl, a firefighter, and Erin, a medical student, crossed paths through mutual friends. Unbeknownst to Erin, her sister, Shelley, had a prior connection with Carl from paramedic class. Carl and Erin enjoyed their time getting to know each other and living in the Fan district before life's unpredictable currents soon swept them away on a journey. Erin's Navy commitment post medical school led them through Suffolk, VA, Pensacola, FL, Jacksonville, FL, Norfolk, VA, and Bethesda, MD, spanning the years 2002-2014, eventually bringing them back home to The River City. Before heading off to their new location, the couple married at Winfree Memorial Baptist Church in March of 2002. The reception was held at Salisbury Country Club where they are now members.

Erin has called Chesterfield, VA home since she was a child. She attended Monacan High School before heading to the University of Virginia where she earned a bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies as an Echols scholar.


Erin joined the Navy on a Health Professions Scholarship Program in 1998, which funded her medical school. "My grandfather served in the Navy, and I always had an interest in military service," says Erin. In 2002, she earned a Doctor of Medicine degree. She chose to study medicine due to her natural talent in the sciences and her enjoyment of working with people.

Erin was active duty for 12 years, first as a Navy flight surgeon, deploying as the squadron doctor to Italy, Iceland, Bahrain, Ghana, El Salvador and Bolivia, and then as a dermatologist. Erin didn't plan on choosing dermatology as her profession, but during an internship required by the Navy, she fell in love with dermatology. It provided a diverse practice environment. From seeing patients of

all ages to having a lot of variety in the dayto-day work with skin cancer screenings, surgeries, cosmetic and laser procedures, it was never boring. She also found that because dermatological care can be so personal and impactful to each patient, they often participate more fully in the treatment plan to better their skin.

While at the VA, Erin served as the Dermatology Consultant to the White House Medical Unit for 18 months in 2012-2013. This was one of the greatest honors of her career. She also ran a Dermatology clinic at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center that serviced the higher-ranking military officials within the Department of Defense as well as members of Congress, the Supreme Court and the President's Cabinet. Additionally, she did humanitarian work as a dermatologist aboard the USNS Comfort -one of two Navy hospital ships and at a Navajo Indian reservation in Chinle, AZ.

After transitioning to the Navy Reserves, Erin joined a private practice in Glen

Allen called Dominion Dermatology. After two and a half years of balancing this full-time role and serving as a Navy reservist, she accepted a position with the Central Virginia VA Healthcare System in Richmond, VA. This transition was particularly helpful when the reserves activated her to work at the Javitz center in NYC treating Covid patients during the height of the pandemic.

While there, she was promoted to Chief of Dermatology and served in that role from 2019-2023. Additionally, she was actively involved in training VCU dermatology residents. She also supervised Navy residents during annual training times with the reserves at Naval Medical Center San Diego and Walter Reed National Military Medical Center.

Carl also grew up in the Richmond area. After graduating from Midlothian High School, Carl volunteered as a firefighter for



several years at Station #5 in Midlothian. He fell in love with the service and camaraderie in the fire department. It gave him a greater sense of purpose. He was hired as a Chesterfield County Fire and EMS firefighter in 1995. He worked all over the North end of Chesterfield County in various stations as a firefighter/paramedic.

While stationed in Jacksonville, Fl, Erin and Carl made their best memories together. Carl took a leave of absence and was able to go back to school and earn a business degree from St. Johns River College. Erin says, "It was our first true 'home'. We grew as a couple and made great friends. We got our two miniature schnauzers, Jaxie, named after Jacksonville, and Carson, who we rescued. They have since passed, but we enjoyed every second with them."

Fortunately, Erin was stationed back in VA, and Carl was rehired. He commuted from Norfolk or Bethesda for the next



eight years every three days for his overnight shift. Erin says, "This was such a sacrifice for him to make and took a lot of commitment on his part."

After moving back to Richmond, Carl was promoted to the position of Captain within Chesterfield Fire and EMS. During the last few years, he greatly enjoyed leading the tactical medics of Chesterfield Fire in their support of state and local police SWAT teams. Carl retired from Chesterfield County Fire and EMS in February after 25 years of service, rising to the rank of Captain. Erin very recently retired from the U.S. Navy Reserves after 24 total years of service, 12 active duty and 12 reserves, having risen to the rank of Navy Captain (O6).

Carl and Erin have two children, seventeen-year-old Ella Adams and elevenyear-old Brady Adams. Ella is currently a senior at Trinity Episcopal School. She enjoys that Trinity has allowed her the



opportunity to have a great high school education balanced with enjoying the fine arts, as well as following championship sports teams.

Her greatest passion is horseback riding, which she has been doing since the age of eight. Now, she competes at rated shows locally, regionally, and nationally.
